



Prep Survey


Following your feedback on the United Learning Survey and the PRD Parent survey, we are currently reviewing our approach to Prep. We want to hear your views.

Epraise is our main method of communicating with parents. Parents have asked to know more about what their child is doing at school, and we are looking at how the EPRAISE App can be used to do this.

To get the most out of your EPRAISE App you need to have notifications enabled. This means you get immediate updates on any points your child has received or any incidents they have been involved in, including informing you about detentions. We are currently looking at how we can inform parents of the details of the points/detentions so you can have meaningful conversations with your child at home.



I want to say thank you to Mrs Harding our fab College Manager who is also a parent at the Academy, as we are working together to get the most out of this app.

Each week we will be adding to this so that parents are informed about each step they need to take.



To get the App on your phone:

To register on our iOS or Android app you can:

- 1. Download our app (just search for epraise in your app store) and open it
- 2. Select your school
- 3. Tap the 'Register' button

- 5. Tap the 'Request login code' button
- 6. Enter the login code sent via email
- 7. Tap 'Login'
