We don't want to take legal action BUT we do want your child to attend school. If you need support –please contact Mr Warren or our Attendance Team.

All parents will have received an email about their child's attendance since September over the last week. Where your child's attendance is lower than 93% we will be looking at taking legal action to encourage you to ensure that your child attends school.

Action Swindon Borough Council will take includes:

Warning Letter

Swindon Borough Council can give each parent an official warning letter. If your child's attendance does not improve after this a fine will be applied for.

Fine

Swindon Borough Council can give each parent a fine of £60, which rises to £120 each if you do not pay within 21 days. If you do not pay the fine after 28 days you may be prosecuted for your child's absence from school.

Initial Case Discussion

Swindon Borough Council will invite you to attend a meeting at school to discuss your child's absence. If attendance continues to be a concern after this meeting. The council will consider whether to move to prosecution or Education Supervision Order.

Prosecution

You could get a fine of up to £2,500, a community order or a jail sentence up to 3 months. The court also gives you a Parenting Order.

Parenting Order

This means you have to go to parenting classes. You'll also have to do what the court says to improve your child's school attendance.

Education Supervision Order

If the council thinks you need support getting your child to go to school but you're not co-operating, they can apply to a court for an Education Supervision Order.

A supervisor will be appointed to help you get your child into education. The local council can do this instead of prosecuting you, or as we

Without notifications, the EPRAISE App (or website) will still let you know about your child, but you will need to remember to check the app (website) every day.

91% of our parents have accessed EPRAISE in the last 2 weeks. This is fantastic but we need the remaining 9 parents to access EPRAISE. We are going to contact these parents over the next week. Without accessing EPRAISE, our parents will miss out on valuable information. We use EPRAISE to communicate with you.

Epraise

Parents are telling us that communication with the Academy is really important. We are constantly looking at how EPRAISE can help us do this. Eventually you will be able to receive notifications about your child's behaviour incidents and sanctions directly via notifications. We are taking steps each week to move towards this.

WEEK 1: Download the EPRAISE App on your phone and check that your phone is allowing

notifications from this App. WEEK 2: If you have notifications enabled from this week, the points your child receives and the reasons they have be Week 3: You can view your child's profile on the EPRAISE app, they are listed as tabs on the main screen. Here you can see how they are doing in school, in areas such as achievement, behaviour, interventions attendance. On the website, you can view your child/children's profiles under the My children tab





Week 4: Here you can view all your child's/children's homework and notes set by their teachers. On our website, you can find this under My Children > Planner and on our app you can find this under the More menu for each child. Please be aware that your child clicks whether the prep work is completed. We know that you want to encourage your child to complete their Prep (99% of you said this) Using this tool will help you know what they need to complete each night

Week 5: Accessing your messages

91% of our parents are accessing EPRAISE but only 58% of messages we send are read by our parents. It is essential parents read their messages if they are to know what is happening at the Academy.

It was fantastic to celebrate the 390 students in Years 7-10 who had completed 100% of their prep over the past 2 weeks at our Friday afternoon reward event.

Since removing prep detentions and focusing on rewards, 268 students in Years 7-9 (51%), and 122 students (65%) of Year 10s completed 100% of their prep.

Epraise points for prep by year group



520 students (74%) have received at least 1 additional Epraise point for prep, with 8010 additional Epraise points awarded for prep over the past 2 weeks, totalling £320 for students to spend in the Epraise shop.

It's great to see so many students taking responsibility, however...

We need your support with this, 99% of our parents said they would support their child to complete their prep if we moved to a system of rewards and not sanctions. Your child needs your support with this, please celebrate the points your child receives and encourage them to do their Prep.

We are not going to settle with 51% Prep completion as this means 49% of our students will not make as much progress as they should. Where students do not complete their prep over a period of time, they will fall below the standards of their peers. This will result in set changes and lower attainment at the end of year 11.

As parents and carers, there are ways we can support our children to give them the best chance to stay mentally healthy. Encouraging and guiding a child to think about their own mental health and wellbeing are vital skills you can teach them from a young age.

Find out how you can help a child to have good mental health, including knowing how to talk to a child about their mental health, and when to spot signs they might be struggling. Plus get self-care tips for you, to help you look after your mental health while caring for others, and find out how to get more support if you, your child or your family need it.

Ways to support a child or young person



Be there to listen

Regularly ask your child how they're doing, to help them get used to talking about their feelings, and know there's always someone there to listen. You can get tips on <u>Young Minds: How to talk to</u> <u>your child about mental health</u>.



Support them through difficulties

Pay attention to how your child is feeling or behaving and try to help them work through difficulties. It may not be easy facing challenging behaviour, but try to help them understand what they're feeling and why. Learn more from <u>the Maudsley</u> <u>Charity on difficult behaviour</u>.



Stay involved in their life

Show interest in their life and what's important to them. It not only helps them value who they are but also makes it easier for you to spot problems and support them.



Take what they say seriously

Listening to and valuing what they say makes them feel valued. Consider how to help them work through their emotions in constructive ways. <u>Anna Freud Centre's guide on ways to</u> <u>support children and young people</u> has more on this.



Encourage their interests

Support and encourage your child to explore their interests. Being active or creative, learning new things and being a part of a team helps connect us and boost our mental wellbeing.



Build positive routines

Try to have structure around regular routines, especially around healthy eating and exercise. A good night's sleep is also important, so have a fixed time for going to bed and getting up. The <u>Sleep Charity</u> <u>has relaxation sleep tips for children</u>.
