## What is a learning disability?

A learning disability is a reduced intellectual ability and difficulty with everyday activities - for example household tasks, socialising or managing money - which affects someone for their whole life.

People with a learning disability tend to take longer to learn and may need support to develop new skills, understand complicated information and interact with other people.

## Dyslexia

- Dyslexia
- Dyslexia is the number one learning disability that affects people of all ages. It affects a person's reading and language processing skills.
- Some symptoms of dyslexia include:
- Reversing the position of letters
- Difficulty with phonological awareness (the ability to break down words into their constituent sounds)
- Struggle with reading comprehension
- Delayed speech
- Difficulty learning auditory processing disorder new vocabulary or rhymes
- Having disorders in visual processing may have trouble understanding directions
- Affects spelling, copying from text, proofreading, reading comprehension


## Dyscalculia

- Dyscalculia is a learning disability that affects maths skills. It can make it difficult for a person to understand math concepts, perform arithmetic calculations, and solve maths problems.
- Dyscalculia is more severe than just not liking Maths because it's diagnosing a learning disability that makes it challenging to understand even the most basic maths concepts.
- Symptoms of dyscalculia may include:
- People with dyscalculia have difficulty understanding math concepts, difficulty with basic arithmetic operations (such as addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division), and difficulty with more complex math skills (such as algebra and geometry).
- Struggling with mathematical concepts such as measuring, time, and estimating
- Being unsure of how to do basic math problems
- Difficulty following the order of operations
- Finding it challenging to count and group numbers together
- Dysgraphia is a learning disability that affects a person's ability to write. It can manifest as difficulty with spelling, poor handwriting, or trouble putting thoughts on paper.
- Dysgraphia can be caused by a variety of factors, including neurological conditions, developmental delays, or difficulty with fine motor skills.
- Symptoms of dysgraphia may include:
- Difficulty with written expression
- Messy handwriting
- Taking a long time to write
- Struggling to express thoughts in a clear sentence structure
- Poor grammar
- Problems organizing thoughts and ideas in writing,
- Difficulties organizing pages, chapters, books

## FORMER SWINDON ACADEMY PRINCIPAL WINS LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

There were resounding cheers in Birmingham Botanical Gardens last Friday night as Ruth Robinson, who served as Principal of Swindon Academy until February of this year, was awarded a Lifetime Achievement Award. Ruth, who is due to retire next month, was recognised at United Learning's Best in Everyone Awards.

The annual awards celebrate students and staff from across United Learning for their exceptional contributions to school and community life. This includes recognition of academic success, accomplishment in sport, music and the arts and dedication to leadership and service. Individuals and teams from across the Group were nominated by their schools with the winners decided by a panel of judges.

Ruth had been nominated by her colleagues at Swindon Academy where she was Principal for over ten years. Nominating Ruth, her colleagues said that Ruth has been on a 'crusade' to drive standards of education' to deliver long-term positive benefits to students. Ruth was said to be dedicated to 'raising students' expectations of themselves' so that they follow their dreams and ambitions.

Under Ruth's leadership, Swindon Academy was judged 'Good' by Ofsted with inspectors recognising how ambitious Ruth was for students and how focused she was on their safety and wellbeing. Ruth was pivotal in raising standards and last summer the academy was the top school in Swindon for GCSE progress and attainment.

Ruth played a key role in brokering a partnership with Marlborough College which seeks to provide the academy's students with enrichment opportunities that might not otherwise be available to them.

She was also Executive Principal of United Learning's Nova Hreod Academy helping to raise standards in all areas. Before joining Swindon Academy, Ruth was Principal of United Learning's North Oxfordshire Academy. Prior to that, she led the International School and Community College (East Birmingham) transforming the quality of education provided there.

Accepting her award, Ruth said:

It was a wonderful surprise to be nominated and receive this lifetime award. It has been a huge privilege to lead Swindon Academy and serve the communities of Penhill and Pinehurst for the past eleven years. I have loved watching our pupils flourish and achieve under the care of an incredible senior leadership team, dedicated teachers and committed support staff. I will take away many happy and fond memories of my time as Principal of Swindon Academy with me into my retirement. I would like to wish the pupils and staff all the very best for the future.

## Criminal exploitation and gangs

We have advice about how to spot the signs of criminal exploitation and involvement in gangs and what support is available for children and young people.

## How are young people recruited?

A child or young person might be recruited into a gang because of where they live or because of who their family is. They might join because they don't see another option or because they feel like they need protection. Children and young people may become involved in gangs for many reasons, including:

- peer pressure and wanting to fit in with their friends
- they feel respected and important
- they want to feel protected from other gangs, or bullies
- they want to make money, and are promised rewards
- they want to gain status, and feel powerful
- they've been excluded from school and don't feel they have a future

Organised criminal gangs groom children and young people because they're less suspicious and are given lighter sentences than adults.

Studies show that a child is more at risk of being recruited if:

- they've been excluded from school
- they have special education needs
- there are problems at home like neglect, domestic abuse or sexual abuse
- they have problems with their mental health
- they live in existing gang territory

If you're worried a child or young person is being groomed for criminal exploitation or to join a gang, contact our helpline immediately. Our trained counsellors can signpost you to local services and provide professional advice.
